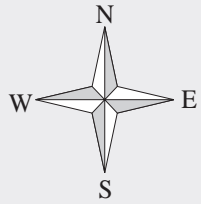







Areas Open to Shrimping

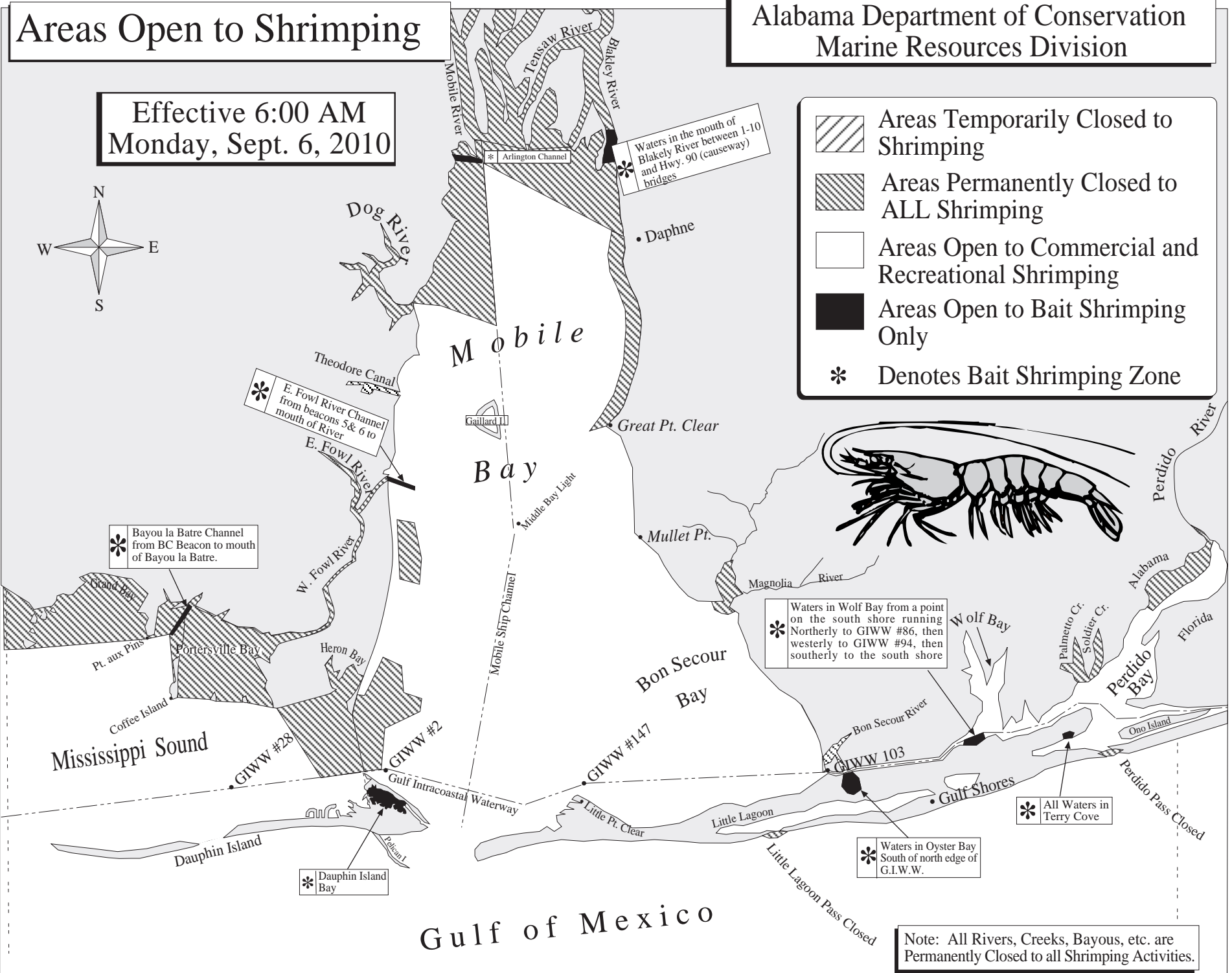

Waters in the mouth of Blakely River between I-10 and Hwy. 90 (causeway) bridges

E. Fowl River Channel from beacons 5& 6 to mouth of River

Bayou la Batre Channel from BC Beacon to mouth of Bayou la Batre.

Waters in Wolf Bay from a point on the south shore running Northerly to GIWW #86, then westerly to GIWW #94, then southerly to the south shore

All Waters in Terry Cove

Waters in Oyster Bay South of north edge of G.I.W.W.

Note: All Rivers, Creeks, Bayous, etc. are Permanently Closed to all Shrimping Activities.

Pursuant to Section 9-12-46, Code of Alabama as stated by Rule 220-3-.01 the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Marine Resources Division announces that as of 6:00 am, **Monday, September 6, 2010** the following waters will **open** to shrimping:

- **All Alabama waters of Mobile and Baldwin Counties not permanently closed by law or regulation.**

Fishermen should contact Alabama Marine Resources Division 251-861-2882 or 251-968-7576 if they suspect any odor or crude oil contamination of their catch. After hours call 251-476-1256.

Fishermen should be aware that state biologists will continue to monitor the size of shrimp throughout state waters. Should sampling indicate the average size of shrimp is smaller than 68 shrimp per pound, additional announcements will be provided to modify the original announcement.
