



- **LOCATION:** South of Alexander City on AL Highway 128.
- **HOURS OF OPERATION:** 7 a.m. until sundown (day use).
- **ADMISSION:**
\$2 for Adults (\$3 on weekends)
\$1 ages 6-11
\$1 seniors age 62 and over
children under 6 admitted free.
- **RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES:**
Camping, cabin rentals, boating, fishing, fishing tournaments, swimming, hiking, playground and picnic areas.
- **RV CAMPER / BOAT STORAGE:** \$50 per month, \$3 per day.
- **PAVILION RENTAL:** \$50 per day.
- **CAMPING:** 626 modern campsites and 16 horse camping sites. Reservations taken Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.
- **FISHING:** Access to Lake Martin. Jon boat rentals \$12 per day (life jackets and paddles included). Fishing license required.
- **MARINA:** Bait, camping and boating supplies. Hours 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.
- **HIKING:**
Two hiking trails, rated moderate to difficult, and one 10-mile horseback riding trail. Overnight horse camping available.

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WIND CREEK STATE PARK

South of Alexander City on Alabama Highway 128 you'll find the largest state-owned campground in the United States, Wind Creek State Park. However, that distinction is not the only thing that makes Wind Creek special.

Wind Creek's 1,445 scenic acres hug the shoreline of beautiful Lake Martin making the park an angler's paradise. Crappie, bluegill and striped bass are just a few of the species the lake has to offer. Several fishing tournaments are held in the park each year as well. Past events include the American Bass Anglers' Tour, the Airport Marine Team Trail and the Pine Level Bassmasters.

Run out of bait or need other supplies? The park marina offers live bait, tackle, hunting and fishing licenses, and other supplies. Boat slips are available for rent on a daily or monthly basis.

The park's 626 campsites are spread over 320 acres and offer ample opportunities to enjoy a variety of outdoor activities. From full RV hook-ups to primitive camping, including 187 waterfront sites, campers have many options. There are also 16 sites available for horse camping. Bathhouses and playground facilities are conveniently located throughout the park.

For guests who prefer to stay in a cabin, the park has seven camping cabins to choose from, one of which is handicap accessible. Each air-conditioned cabin has a kitchenette and a private bathroom. Guests need to bring their own bed linens and towels. Cooking and eating utensils are not provided.

Winding over rolling ridges, through tall pines and down to the lake's shoreline, the park's two hiking trails offer beautiful views of wildflowers, blooming dogwoods, and various wildlife. New to Wind Creek is the Jeff Reed Horse Trail, a 10 mile horseback riding trail, which takes riders along a stream through a vast forest of hardwoods and pines.

With a variety of outdoor activities to choose from there is something for everyone to enjoy at Wind Creek State Park. Other area attractions include: Lakewinds Golf Course, Lake Martin Amphitheater, Children's Harbor, Horseshoe Bend National Military Park, Sinclair's Restaurant in Kowaliga, and downtown Alexander City.
