



# MONSANTO

The Monsanto Tract in Marshall County consists of 209 donated acres of mountainous pines and hardwoods on a scenic peninsula on Lake Guntersville that is being managed as both an extension of Guntersville State Park and to provide nesting habitat for the growing population of Bald Eagles.

## Directions:

From Guntersville, exit off of US 431 in Guntersville on to AL-227 (Lusk Street). Go approximately 6.6 miles and turn left into Guntersville State Park.

Bald Eagles (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) were protected by a precursor to the Endangered Species Act in 1967 and were one of the original species protected by the Endangered Species Act in 1973. On June 28, 2007, the Bald Eagle was removed from the threatened and endangered species list. It remains protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act.
