



WEHLE

The Wehle Tract in Bullock County consists of 1,505 acres of rolling pine hills and hardwood branch bottoms that are used for public recreation and a nature preserve. Approximately 640 acres are used for public hunting within the adjacent Barbour County Wildlife Management Area.

This purchase involved a discounted sale, whereby the landowner voluntarily sold the tract for 50% of the appraised value.

Recreational opportunities abound on the tract and include camping, fishing, canoeing, hiking, horseback riding, wildlife observation, mountain biking and hunting.

Adjoining the tract is the Wehle Nature Center, provided by the State Lands Division to promote environmental education.

Directions:

From Montgomery, travel North on I-85. Take exit 11 and turn right onto AL 110. Stay on AL-110 until it ends at US 82. Turn left onto US 82E and travel through Union Springs to Midway. Once in Midway, turn right onto AL-51 and take the first left onto Bullock Co. Rd. 47/Pleasant Hill Road. The Wehle Forever Wild Tract and the Wehle Nature Center will be on your right. The brown "Nature Center" signs will also guide you to the tract.

From Eufaula, travel West on US 82. Turn left onto Barbour Co. Rd. 49 and follow the brown Nature Center signs to the Wehle Forever Wild Tract and to the Wehle Nature Center.
